

Annual land valuations 2019









On 6 March 2019, the Valuer-General issued annual statutory land valuations to all landowners in 18 Queensland rateable local government areas in accordance with the *Land Valuation Act 2010*.

How are valuations determined?

- Registered valuers research the property market and examine trends and sales information for each land use category.
- New valuations are determined that reflect the movement in the property market since the last valuation.

Council rates

- A change in valuation does not necessarily mean that your council rates will change.
